### David Malan Awards

**September 10th-19th.** The David Malin Awards—Winning Sky Photos is a Museum of Applied Arts and Sciences travelling exhibition. South West Arts has hosted the Exhibition, in partnership with the Powerhouse Museum (Sydney), for the past four years. The photography exhibition showcases the remarkable skills of Australia's talented astrophotographers, displaying the top entries from the 2021 David Malin astrophotography competition, held annually by the Central West Astronomical society and judged by world-renowned astrophotographer Dr. David Malin. The competition aims to encourage photographers from across Australia to use their vision and skill to produce inspiring and beautiful images of the sky. There are six photographic award categories: Wide Field, Deep sky, Junior, Nightscapes, Solar System and Open Theme. <https://davidmalinawards.com/>

Thomas Mayo (né Mayor, born c. 1978) is an Indigenous Australian (Kaurareg Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander) Australian human rights advocate and author. He is a signatory and advocate of the Indigenous Voice to Parliament, and a trade union organiser. Mayo is the author of many books as well as having had many articles and essays published in The Guardian, Griffith Review and The Sydney Morning Herald. In 2019, his essay "A dream that cannot be denied: On the road to Freedom Day", later published in the Griffith Review, was highly commended by the Horne Prize judges. It examines the legacy of the Wave Hill Walk-Off (Gurindji Strike), and the need for a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution. His books include: Finding the Heart of the Nation: The Journey of the Uluru Statement Towards Voice, Treaty and Truth. Mayor, T. (2019). The Voice to Parliament Handbook: All the Detail You Need. Hardie Grant Explore. With Kerry O'Brien; cartoons by Cathy Wilcox. The Voice to Parliament Handbook, was awarded Australian Book Industry Awards Book of the Year, 2024.

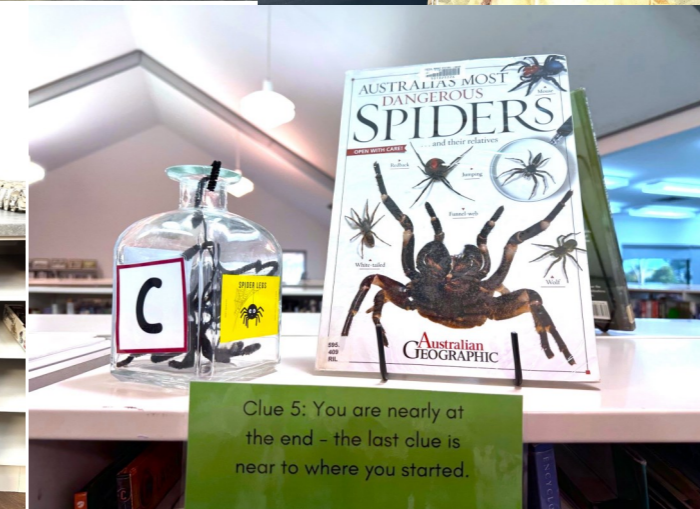
